We are in just North of Houston in the Spring area and were recently devastated by Hurricane Harvey. Our hospital has been in the Spring area since 1970. Originally founded by Jack Whitmore, we truly pride ourselves on the level of care and compassion that we offer our patients and clients when serving their pets. Our patient count topped 18000 for the four doctors prior to the flooding even in August of 2017. Many clients have been with the practice for over 40 years, and continue to drive to our clinic after moving to other communities because they feel we truly care about their pets.

Aside from medicine, serving our community is part of our mission statement. We donated a large portion of our property to the county to serve as the first dog park on our area. Serving the special needs community, we encourage volunteers from groups who aim to provide meaningful work to our friends in a safe environment. Many of the agriculturally and medically focused students from the local high schools can volunteer with us weekly to gain valuable experience towards their future careers. Rescue groups such as Abandoned Animal Rescue, Poodle Rescue of Houston, Golden Beginnings, and Basset Buddies bring their pets to us so that we can provide quality care at reasonable prices. And, most proudly, we created a 501c3 group to help our clients that have fallen on hard times afford the care that their pets need without concerns of finances. We have now fallen on those hard times and struggle to ask for what we have always been eager to provide. Our hospital took on 4.5 feet of floodwater during the storm and lost everything. At that time, we were also boarding 40 dogs and 17 cats whom we had to boat out of the second floor of the boarding facility. Our dedicated employees waded through the rising water on Saturday and Sunday to care for each of those pets, and eventually helped the coast guard and our local "Bubbas with Boats" get each and every one of those pets to safety.

Perhaps the hardest moment for the Stuebner Airline Veterinary Hospital family was to walk through this fantastic hospital that we poured our blood, sweat, and tears into and to see it reduced to a slime encrusted shell with swollen books and medical supplies tossed throughout the building like the trash that it now was. We have 70 employees and our priority is to them and to make sure that their families are provided for.

We will rebuild, but we are asking for help.
